Kia ora whānau

New Kitchen Official Opening — We will be holding an assembly and an official opening of our kitchen tomorrow Friday 26th May at 2.00pm.

This will be followed by a celebratory afternoon tea (provided). I know the students have been busy in the kitchen with Andrea preparing food for this. All whānau welcome!

Keeping Ourselves Safe — Senior Constable Ross Greer finished at the end of last week and classes have been completing follow-up activities. One discussion point was the number for NZ emergency services (111 - some children only knew overseas emergency numbers), as well as the importance of being able to make an emergency call on a cell phone. All cell phones are different, so this would be an important discussion you could have with your tamariki.

Another discussion was about what to do if someone you don't know asked you to get in their car. Ross discussed how a child should seek help, such as run back to school, go to the nearest shop, go to a close friend's place, another important discussion you could have with your tamariki.

Art Gallery Trips – Rātā (10.00am-12.00pm) and Kōwhai (12.00-2.00pm) will be going **next Friday 2 June**. Buses leave school half an hour before each session. Parents are welcome to join us.

Further Primary Teachers Industrial Action – There is still a possibility of a strike next Wednesday 31 May. It won't be confirmed until Sunday. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

National Young Leaders' Day – I will be taking six senior students to the National Young Leaders' Day next Tuesday 30th May in the Town Hall.

This is a day where students from many schools hear from inspirational Kiwis in their chosen fields, and is an important part of our Year 6 Leadership Programme.

Grandparents' Reading – We continue to have a dedicated group of grandparents reading with our tamariki every Thursday morning. The children are enthusiastic about going and enjoy sharing their books. If you know of an older person in the community who may like to volunteer please contact Linda in the school office.

Lego Club – We are very fortunate to have our Social Worker in Schools (SWiS), Lynda Davidson, here to work with our students every Thursday. She works one on one with some students and also works with small groups.

From next Thursday Lynda is starting a Lego club at lunchtime in the library, alternating between Kōwhai and Rātā rooms at this stage. This will be a fun, supported activity, and great for the upcoming colder months.

Music Tuition – Every Monday afternoon Hiliako laheto takes music with the Kōwhai and Rātā rooms. The students have made a choice between learning the ukulele or drums. The ukulele group is busy practising for the Ukulele Jam, while the drumming group are enjoying creating patterns and rhythms on upturned buckets, using their hands and drumsticks. It is great to see the students involved in the music and having a lot of fun with it.

Kindy Visit – This was postponed last week due to the wet weather, and will now happen next Wednesday 31 May.


