Sometimes if you fall it's not always a problem. This is not like Brad's story. Brad was a professional wakeboarder and he was in competitions all over the USA when he went through a horrible accident and nearly died.



Brad broke his neck doing a triple flip in training. He had nine hours of surgery and had to stay in a hospital for five months and he now has to deal with constant muscle spasms and pain.

Brad is now in a wheelchair, he is a tetraplegic. This means he can't move his arms and legs. He can only move his head and shoulders. He has a straw to move his wheelchair around and if he sipped hard on the straw he would move backwards. If he sipped softly he would move left and if he blows hard he moves forward and if he blows soft he turns right.

Brad didn't accept his injury at first. He became depressed and he wished the accident didn't happen or that the injury wasn't as bad. He had a lot of support from family and friends from the wakeboard community and a life coach. He has now accepted the injury and takes part in diving and holding his breath. He is positive about life and he is a professional speaker.
