Additional lessons outside of school are also recommended, although they come at a cost.

There are several swimming clubs in Dunedin. When my two boys were learning to swim they joined the Dunedin Swim Club, which is a noncompetitive club that focuses on teaching children of all levels to swim. It's at Moana Pool every Friday in term time from 6.15-7.15pm and annual membership fees are very reasonable. 
