The students have been busy in the last week making their artwork for the art competition. They are welcome to submit extra entries that they have made at home.


Parents and pre-schoolers are very welcome to come along and view the artworks, baking and animals, and join in with the activity stations.

They have received \$644,000 that will go towards continuing to run the Wheako Programme at Concord School and other schools in our cluster, as well as other youth initiatives in the area.

The Wheako Programme "enhances peer relationships and fosters a great sense of belonging, especially for students facing challenges". Two projects the Wheako Programme was involved in here in the last two years were designing and planting the garden behind the hall, and organising and running the Wheako Fair. This year Noah and Bri have been coming in one day a week at lunchtime to join in activities with the children and/or running futsal coaching sessions.
